**DECLARATION OF KARL L. CAMBRONNE
IN SUPPORT OF JOINT MOTION FOR ATTORNEYS' FEES AND
REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES FILED ON BEHALF OF
CHESTNUT CAMBRONNE PA**

Karl L. Cambronne, declares as follows:

1. I am President of the law firm of Chestnut Cambronne PA. I submit this declaration in support of my firm's application for an award of attorneys' fees in connection with services rendered in the above-captioned action (the Action"), as well as for reimbursement of expenses incurred by my firm in connection with the Action.

2. My firm which served as one of the Lead Counsel in this Action appointed in this Court's Order of January 18, 2012 (Docket # 307). Since that time I have been involved in all aspects of the litigation and its settlement as set forth in the Joint Declaration submitted by me and my co-Lead Counsel in support of Lead Plaintiffs' motion for final approval of the Settlement and Lead Counsel's motion for an award of attorneys' fees and reimbursement of expenses.

3. The schedule attached hereto as Exhibit 1 is a detailed summary indicating

the amount of time spent by each attorney and professional support staff of my firm who was involved in this Action, and the lodestar calculation based on my firm's current billing rates. For personnel who are no longer employed by my firm, the lodestar calculation is based upon the billing rates for such personnel in his or her final year of employment by my firm. The schedule was prepared from contemporaneous daily time records regularly prepared and maintained by my firm, which are available at the request of the Court. Time expended in preparing this application for fees and reimbursement of expenses has not been included in this request.

4. The hourly rates for the attorneys and professional support staff in my firm included in Exhibit 1 are the same as the regular current rates charged for their services in class action contingent matters and which have been accepted in other securities or shareholder litigation.

5. The Schedule attached hereto as Exhibit 2, is analysis of the time spent by each attorney and professional support staff with respect to sixteen (16) major categories of work performed in connection with the Action.

6. The total number of hours expended on this Action by my firm from its inception through and including September 18, 2012, is 2,206.20. The total lodestar for my firm for that period is \$1,176,130.00, consisting of \$1,170,290.00 for attorneys' time and \$5,840.00 for professional support staff time.

7. My firm's lodestar figures are based upon the firm's billing rates, which rates do not include charges for expense items. Expense items are billed separately and

such charges are not duplicated in my firm's billing rates.

8. As detailed in Exhibit 3, my firm has incurred a total of \$20,151.18 in unreimbursed expenses in connection with the prosecution of this Action from its inception through and including September 18, 2012.

9. The expenses incurred in this Action are reflected on the books and records of my firm. These books and records are prepared from expense vouchers, check records and other source materials and are an accurate record of the expenses incurred.

10. With respect to the standing of my firm, attached hereto as Exhibit 4 is a brief biography of my firm and attorneys in my firm who were principally involved in this Action.

**SHAREHOLDER, ANTITRUST, AND CONSUMER-PROTECTION
CLASS ACTION LITIGATION**

For almost 50 years, Chestnut Cambronne PA has been representing clients in class action litigation both in the Twin Cities area and nationally. Since its inception, Chestnut Cambronne has been engaged in complex litigation throughout the country and successfully prosecuted and defended class litigation addressing substantive legal questions in the fields of securities, ERISA, banking, antitrust, and consumer-protection law. Representative class action cases resolved in the last few years in which the firm or its members acted as lead counsel or co-lead counsel include the following:

Mooney v. Allianz Life Ins. Co. of North America, No. 06-545 ADM/FLN, 2010 WL 419962 (D. Minn. Jan. 29, 2010). This was a certified class action in which Chestnut Cambronne was co-lead counsel seeking damages of \$2 billion. After a three-week trial, the jury concluded Allianz made false and misleading statements intentionally in violation of the statute, but did not award damages.

In re United Healthcare, Inc. Shareholder Derivative Litig., 631 F.3d 913 (8th Cir. 2011), *affirming* 631 F. Supp. 2d 1151 (D. Minn. 2009). This is a settled shareholder derivative case involving the backdating of stock options. Chestnut Cambronne served as lead counsel and recovered on behalf of the company a settlement valued at \$922 million. Today, it remains the largest recovery in a shareholder derivative case in United States history.

In re Xcel Energy, Inc. Sec, Derivative & "ERISA" Litig, 364 F. Supp. 980, 995-996 (D. Minn. 2005); *In re Xcel Energy Securities, Derivative & "ERISA" Litigation*, 286 F. Supp. 2d 1047 (D. Minn. 2003). This was a securities fraud class action in which Chestnut Cambronne was co-lead counsel. The class recovered \$80 million.

Alford v. Mego Mortgage Home Loan Owner Trust 1997-1; Mazur v. Empire Funding Home Loan Owner Trust 1997-1; and Banks, et al. v. FirstPlus Home Loan Trust 1996-2 (Minn. Dist. Ct. 4th Dist). These are settled consumer-lending cases in which Karl L. Cambronne acted as co-lead counsel.

In re E.W. Blanch Holdings, Inc. Securities Litigation, No 01-258 (JNE/JGL) (D. Minn.) (Securities Fraud). This is a settled securities fraud class action in which Karl Cambronne served as lead counsel. The class recovered \$20 million.

Cooper v. Miller, Johnson, Steichen & Kinnard, No. 02-CV-1236 RHK/AJB) (D. Minn.) (Securities Fraud). This is a settled securities fraud class action in which Karl Cambronne served as lead counsel. The class recovered \$5.6 million.

In re Blue Cross Subscriber Litigation, No. 19-C3-98-7780 (Minn. Dist. Ct. 1st Dist.) (Consumer/Policyholder). This is an action on behalf of Blue Cross subscribers. Over \$41 million was recovered for Blue Cross policy holders. Karl L. Cambronne served as lead counsel.

Cates v. US Bank, National Association, N.D., No. 04-6202 (Minn. Dist. Ct. 4th Dist.) (Consumer). Karl L. Cambronne served as co-lead counsel for the class. Class members received \$25 million.

In re U.S. Bancorp Litigation, 291 F.3d1035 (8th Cir. 2002) (Consumer/Privacy). The class received \$3 million. Karl L. Cambronne acted as lead counsel.

(Consumer Fraud Insurance) These are settled consumer and statutory violations class actions against automobile insurance companies that sold unlawful personal injury protection insurance to Minnesota senior citizens. Karl Cambronne served as lead counsel for the class members in all cases. Class members have received a full return of wage loss premiums previously paid.

Steinhartz v. Saturn Transportation System, Inc., No. 00-2489 GEL/JGL (D. Minn.) (Consumer/Leases) This is a settled consumer class action that alleged a trucking company underpaid its independent contractor truckers. Karl Cambronne served as lead counsel. Class members received \$450,000.

Not only do the results obtained in the above cases attest to the skill and competence of Chestnut Cambronne lawyers in shareholder litigation, various courts have publicly commended Chestnut Cambronne for its efforts:

Plaintiffs' co-lead counsel have significant experience in representing shareholders and shareholder classes in federal securities actions around the country and in this district in particular. Counsel-both the lawyers representing lead plaintiffs and defendants-conducted themselves in an exemplary manner. ... Thus, the effort of counsel in efficiently bringing this case to fair, reasonable and adequate resolution is the best indicator of the experience and ability of the attorneys involved, and this factor supports the court's award of 25%.

In Heller v. Schwan's Sales Enterprises, Inc., 548 N.W.2d 287, 291 (Minn. Ct.

App. 1996), the court of appeals in commenting upon the conduct of Chestnut Cambronne and the other counsel representing the class, concluded:

The district court stated that the class counsel “are known to this Court to be competent litigators with extensive class action experience.” The court found that the class counsel “provided a substantial common benefit to the plaintiff class by zealously pursuing and funding this litigation.”

Lawyers active in the class practice who will be primarily involved in the prosecution of this matter are Karl L. Cambronne and Jeffrey D. Bores.

Karl L. Cambronne

Karl L. Cambronne, a shareholder and president of Chestnut Cambronne PA, is well regarded by the state and federal courts in Minnesota and nationally for his extensive experience acting as lead counsel in securities fraud, antitrust, and consumer class actions as well as in shareholder derivative litigation. He has served as trial counsel in securities and consumer fraud matters and has written and lectured extensively on the subject of class action litigation. See, e.g., *Mooney v. Allianz Life Ins. Co. of North America*, No. 06-545 ADM/FLN, 2010 WL 419962 (D. Minn. Jan. 29, 2010); *In re United Healthcare, Inc. Shareholder Derivative Litig.*, 631 F.3d 913 (8th Cir. 2011), *affirming* 631 F.
